The Magic of Young Eyes.



From a very young age, children tend to hear a lot about royalty. Popular fairy tales, many of them around for hundreds of years, tell tales of beautiful princesses, brave princes, and noble, wise, old kings and queens. They

capture the imagination of young children and transport them into a world of extravagant palaces and riches beyond anything they could imagine.

Modern children's stories and cartoons continue the fascination, but many turn the traditional stereotypes on their head. Princesses no longer wait around to be rescued, but take control into their own hands. Princes don't necessarily want to be brave or to become the next king.

In the time of Jesus kings were powerful rulers, and some were tyrants. We know from earlier in the Gospel that King Herod was capable of brutal acts.

The king that Jesus talks about turns this image of brutality upside down. He is a fair judge, a shepherd who looks after his flock, inviting all who act with justice and generosity to take their place in the kingdom. He is also in solidarity with the least of his people. Jesus is a different sort of royalty, his kingdom is based on charity, compassion and forgiveness.

Pope Francis – "At the end of the world, we will be judged," he said. "And what will the questions be that the judge will ask?" Did you feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, welcome the stranger, clothe the naked, care for the sick and visit the prisoner?"

"As long as you did this to one of these little ones, you did it to me".

The young can visualise the magic of the fairy tale but they also have a tremendous sense of justice and knowing what is the right thing to do. Forgiveness and reconciliation is what Christ's Kingdom is all about.
